

English

This term children will be reading 'Kensuke's Kingdom' and using it as inspiration to write their own adventure stories.

The children will then be writing an information text all about rivers.

Finally, they will write a narrative that is based on the Water Cycle.

Maths


Children will continue to develop their problem solving skills in all areas of Maths. We will be focusing on fractions, decimals and percentages this term, as well as solving problems involving money and time. Maths this term will have a focus on some real life skills, as well as learning how to solve problems involving statistics and analysing data.

Geography

Geography will be a driver subject for this term. Children will begin by learning about the four main climate zones and the six main biomes of the world. They will compare these to the climate in our own country. Later in the term we will focus on rivers and the water system, making links with The Water Cycle and Science.

Art

In Art this term, we will be learning about the artist/impressionist William Turner. Children will explore and discuss his work and will use his work as inspiration for their own. The children will be exploring paint and looking closely at how they can draw, paint and use colour.



PE

This term's PE focus will be developing their skills in athletic events.

Science

During the first half of the term, the children will be learning about animals and their habitats. They will learn about how animals are grouped and classified. They will identify how climate change can impact the habitats of animals. The second half of term, children will focus on states of matter. They will investigate solids, liquids and gases and what happens to them when they are heated or cooled. They will learn why this happens at a molecular level as well as linking this with the Water Cycle.

Design Technology

In the Summer term, the children will be creating their on shell structures.

They will be designing and making a box to package a small gift for sale at the Summer Fayre. They will then evaluate their product to decide what went well and what they could do better next time.

RE

Children will continue to study Judaism. They will consider how Jewish people show their commitment to God.

French

Children will revise their knowledge of colours, numbers and dates. They will also learn different vocabulary to describe people and will listen to traditional stories.

Computing

Children will be using purple mash to complete units around making music and creating animations.

Music

Children will be using BBC Bitesize to learn how to compose their own song. They will be linking this with their a musical piece about storms.
